Turn left (after) leaving freeway. Go 3 and 8/10 miles to Dry Creek Store. Turn left in front of Store go 8/10 mile. Turn right. Go 5/10 mile; 7 or 8 mail boxes on left. BOAT TRIP TO FARALLON ISLANDS

SUNDAY, May 6, 1962, 6:30 AM. to mid-afternoon.

The boat Miss Princeton has been chartered for a trip to the Farallons and back, leaving Hazel's pier at Princeton, San Mateo County, at 6:30 AM., and returning to Hazel's pier by mid-afternoon. Arrangement has been made to have some bait along to throw overboard in order to attract birds close to the boat.

This will be an opportunity to see ocean-going birds which are rarely if ever seen from our shores, such as puffins, auklets, guillemots and murrees. We may even see an albatross. Landing on the Islands will not be possible.

ARRANGEMENTS:
RESERVATIONS ARE NECESSARY. The number of persons going is limited to thirty.

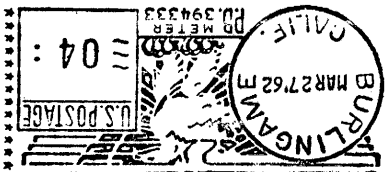
COST: The cost of the boat and bait, including the crew of two men will be borne by the people who make reservations to go on the trip and is estimated at six dollars (\$6.00) a person. The actual cost per person will depend in part on the number of reservations. If at six dollars a person more money is received than is needed to cover the cost of the trip, the excess will be refunded; but no one will be asked to contribute more than the six dollars.

HOW TO RESERVE PASSAGE: Write to Beatrice Brainard, P. O. Box 113, Moss Beach, San Mateo County, Calif. and enclose check for \$6.00 and a self-addressed envelope for receipt-confirmation. When 30 reservations have been received, no more can be accepted; so act promptly.

HOW TO DRESS: Wear WARM clothes, including warm FOOT GEAR and HEAD GEAR; and wear WIND-PROOF clothes. The wind and spray can be really cold; so dress as warmly as possible. This is IMPORTANT.

LUNCH: Each person will take his own lunch.
