APRIL 8 TRIP TO SECRET VALLEY

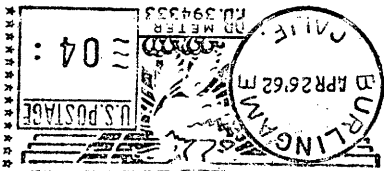
